THE ATLANTA SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA RETURNS TO PIEDMONT PARK FOR FREE CONCERT CELEBRATING ITS 80TH SEASON

ATLANTA – The **Atlanta Symphony Orchestra** announces its much-anticipated return to **Piedmont Park on Tuesday, September 10, at 7:30 pm** with a free performance of symphonic gems on Oak Hill.

William R. Langley conducts the evening's program, featuring a selection of orchestral favorites and a special preview of ASO's two-season epic endeavor, the **Beethoven Project**. Program selections will include movements from Beethoven's Symphony No. 5, Rimsky-Korsakov's *Scheherazade*, and works by Jesse Montgomery and Adolphus Hailstork.

"We're so pleased to be able to return to Piedmont Park to share great music under the stars each year," said Jennifer Barlament, the ASO's Executive Director. "I can't think of a better way, or a better place, to kick off the season than a concert for so many of our beloved Atlantans in the jewel in the crown of Atlanta's parks."

Attendees are encouraged to arrive early, as seating with a good view of the stage is first-come, first-served. Admission is free to the public and tickets are not required. There will also be food trucks with beverages to complete the picnic experience. Family-friendly activities will be hosted by the ASO Education and Community Engagement Department.

Entering its 80th season, the GRAMMY® Award-winning Atlanta Symphony Orchestra, led by Music Director Nathalie Stutzmann is readying a thrilling 2024-2025 program of Classical Greats and stand-out guests. Those in attendance will hear selections from the upcoming season, in addition to well-loved pieces.

Important Concert Information

- The performance will take place at Piedmont Park's Oak Hill, located in the southwest corner of the park.
- Seating with a direct view of the stage is not guaranteed. Patrons are encouraged to arrive early, as seating is on a first-come, first-served basis. The concert begins at 7:30 p.m.
- There is limited parking at the Atlanta Botanical Gardens Parking Facility, adjacent to Piedmont Park. Patrons are encouraged to carpool, ride MARTA to Arts Center Station or Midtown Station, walk or bike to the event.
- Patrons may bring outside food and beverages into the concert area; however, grills, glass containers and outside alcoholic beverages are not permitted.
- Beer, wine and food will be available for purchase on-site.
- Pets are not permitted at this event. However, the Piedmont Park Dog Park will be open.

About William R. Langley

Atlanta Symphony Orchestra Associate Conductor William R. Langley began his career as an orchestral conductor at age 16. In 2009, he founded the Wolf River Chamber Orchestra and in 2011, the Memphis Repertory Orchestra. Langley also serves as the music director of the Atlanta Symphony Youth Orchestra.

An avid performer, the young Maestro has appeared as guest conductor with the Cincinnati Symphony Orchestra, Atlanta Symphony Orchestra, Memphis Symphony Orchestra, Starling Chamber Orchestra, Blueshift Ensemble, Concert: Nova, and All of the Above Ensemble.

In demand as a cover conductor, Langley has been a frequent cover with the symphony orchestras of Atlanta, Baltimore, and Cincinnati covering such conductors as Nathalie Stutzmann, Sir Donald Runnicles, Louis Langrée, Carlos Kalmar, Juanjo Mena, Jonathon Heyward, Ramón Tebar, Peter Oundjian, and Miguel Harth-Bedoya, to name a few.

Langley holds a master's degree in Orchestral Conducting from the College Conservatory of Music (CCM) in Cincinnati. He was selected by members of the Vienna Philharmonic Orchestra and the American

Austrian Foundation to be awarded one of two esteemed Ansbacher Fellowships for Young Conductors with the opportunity to study in Austria at the 2019 Salzburger Festspiele.

Under the leadership of Music Director Nathalie Stutzmann, the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra (ASO) offers live performances, media initiatives, and learning programs that unite, educate and enrich our community through the engaging and transformative power of orchestral music experiences.
